What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?	In-Network: \$1,600 Individual/\$3,200 Family Member/\$3,200 Family Total. Out-of-Network: \$3,200 Individual/ \$6,400 Family Member/\$6,400 Family Total.	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the policy, the overall family <u>deductible</u> must be met before the <u>plan</u> begins to pay.
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	Yes. <u>Preventive care</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> ? Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

If you are eligible for certain types of <u>Minimum Essential Coverage</u>, you may not be eligible for the <u>premium tax credit</u>.


About these Coverage Examples:
